


Pat Perry

Sketchbook Page Art Movements -Pop Art-


Pop Art: art in which commonplace objects (such as comic strips, soup cans, road signs, and hamburgers) were used as subject matter and were often physically incorporated into the work.

 works explore the relationship between artistic expression, advertising, and celebrity culture that flourished by the 1960s, and span a variety of media, including painting, silkscreening, photography, film, and sculpture.


-Post Impressionism-

Post Impressionism: an art movement that developed in the 1890s. It is characterized by a subjective approach to painting, as artists opted to evoke emotion rather than realism in their work.



Vincent Van Gogh

- was a Dutch post-impressionist painter who is among the most famous and influential figures in the history of Western art.
- In a decade, he created about 2,100 artworks, including around 860 oil paintings, most of which date from the last two years of his life.
- characterised by bold colours and dramatic, impulsive and expressive brushwork that contributed to the foundations of modern art
