What Makes a Family of Artists?



Is creative talent, be it novelistic, musical, or artistic, something that you're born with, or is it something that anyone, with practice and dedication, can acquire?

- "Everyone is creative. We're just creative to a different degree."
- "intelligence, associative thinking, divergent thinking, personality traits, motivation, and specific interests."
- creativity was a "synergistic interaction among a cluster of more fundamental characteristics."



Looking to identify "creativity genes"



Tested DNA for three of the genetic variations associated with "seek"-related behaviors

- one of the variants scored higher on verbal creativity
- another showed higher scores on figural creativity (the flexible production of ideas)
- finally, the last scored high on numeric creativity

Why does mental disorder persist in the gene pool?

- Same mutation with positive trait: creativity
- Link between creativity
 +psychosis=reduced cognitive inhibition
- A lower threshold for entertaining alternative thoughts and realities
- Families with talent accompanied by depression and mental illness



Families of writers


- Scored on originality, plot development, sophistication
- Strongly familial and also heritable
 (both genetic and within family environments)
- But it must come from somewhere! (in cases where big talent comes from humble beginnings)

Preparation – becoming immersed in problems and issues that are interesting and that arouse curiosity.

2. Gathering and Reflecting on Information (Incubation)
